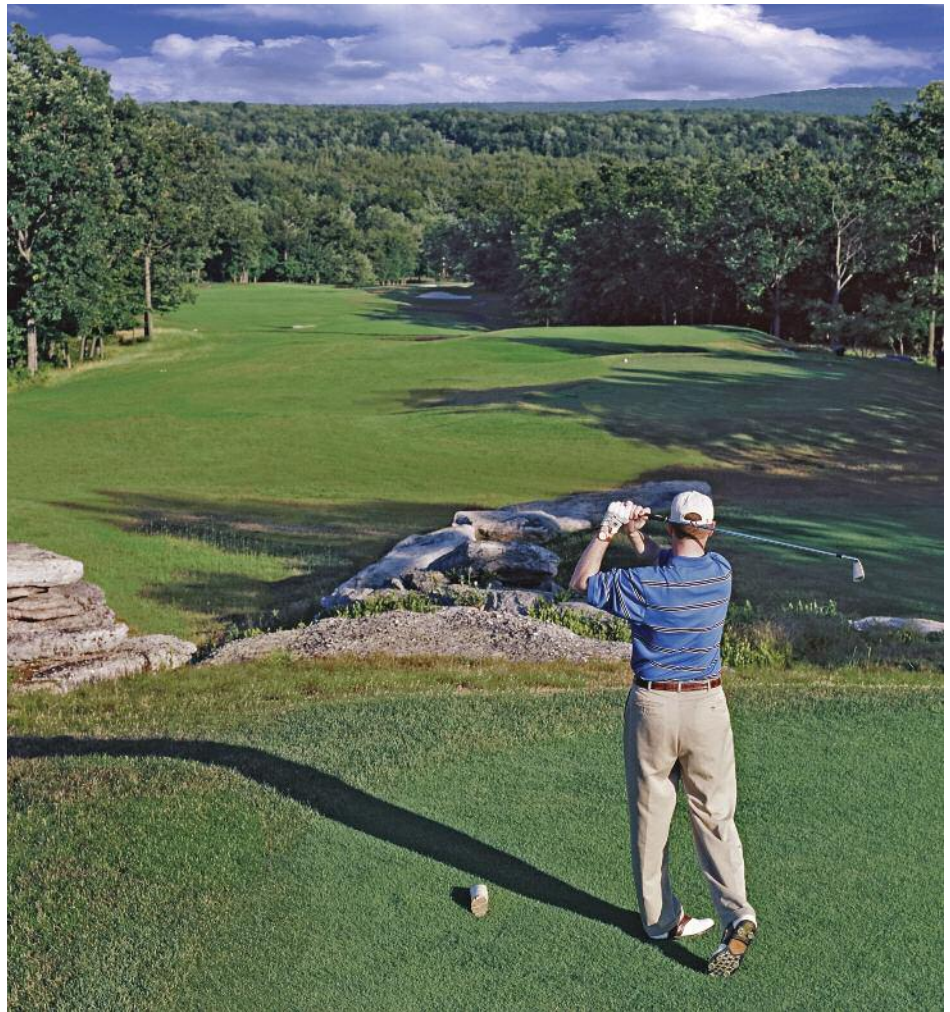

## Golf News

**See the Line.** Everyone who has played the game of golf knows it is not easy to get the ball in the hole. To do so, putting has to be a strong part of your golf game. Seeing the slope of the green and executing a stroke that puts the ball in motion at the right speed are imperative.

Putting starts when you are actually walking up to the green. You can see the slope of the green easier from a distance than when you are on top of it. As you approach your ball, try to visualize what the golf ball will do as it approaches the cup. As you stand or crouch behind your ball, draw an imaginary line with your eyes from the ball to the hole that you think the ball will roll on. Then, pick a spot a few inches in front of the ball on that line. Align yourself so the ball will roll over that spot when the putt is stroked. With your line and alignment already in place, all you have to do is concentrate on speed. You already have committed to the line so speed should be all that you are thinking. Be confident in yourself and don't second guess the line you chose. Put a confident stroke on the ball, and watch the putts start dropping!

### Hit the Big Dog

Golf clubs have come a long way from the old persimmon head drivers. The size and forgiveness that today's drivers offer should be taken advantage of as much as possible. When stepping up to the tee on a tight par four, why not hit the bigger, more forgiving big dog? Chances are that the three or five woods you consider hitting goes out of bounds just as much, if not more than your driver. You actually have many options with the driver. You don't have to tee it high and let it fly every time! On that tight par four, you can choke down on the grip, make a controlled three quarters swing, or tee the ball lower than normal. The forgiveness that is offered with the larger clubface will actually produce a much more controlled shot with a three quarter swing than a full swing with your three wood, putting you in a better position to hit the green with your next shot.

### Dress Code Policy

No denim is allowed on the course or driving range. All players must have a collared shirt (mock is acceptable). Cargo shorts and athletic type shorts are not permitted. It is important that we maintain a proper dress code at all times. To save any embarrassments, please inform your guests of the dress code prior to your arrival to the club.

Please remember alcoholic beverages must be purchased at the club and are not permitted to be brought on the premises by a member or a guest.

### Be Ready to Play

Players should be ready to play as soon as it is their turn to play. When playing on or near the putting green, they should leave their bags or carts in such a position as will enable quick movement off the green and towards the next tee. When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green.

It is a group's responsibility to keep up with the group in front. If it loses a clear hole and it is delaying the group behind, it should invite the group behind to play through, irrespective of the number of players in that group.

Remember that some of you have not met the landscaping requirements yet. This is the season to make sure your landscaping meets all the ACC requirements. I am here Monday-Friday from 8am to 5pm for your convenience.

On a more serious note:

Disregard of the ACC review and approval process is still a huge problem. As a reminder, all approvals for any exterior work must be approved prior to commencement of the project. Also, we ask that you please have a sufficient coach light on your property with the section and lot number clearly visible from the road. We are still currently having problems with trash cans being left out or trash being out without a can. Be advised that there is a company within Eagle Rock that is willing to take your trash cans in or off the street for you. For more information call, 570.751.5050 and ask for Phil.

Note: For all future tree-cutting you will need approval and a permit from the ACC. All contractors are advised that the Building Packet has recently been updated for 2010. Please be sure to stop by the Activity Center and receive an updated copy.

All property owners that completed a home over the winter need to remember that the landscaping should be finished within 120 days and driveways need to be in by June 1st, 2010.

2 tsp. Cayenne Pepper

8 slices of Texas bread or regular white bread	1 1/2 Tsp. Almond extract
4oz softened cream cheese	1 Tbs. Butter
4oz Raspberry preserves	1 Tbs. Confectioner Sugar
5 Large eggs beaten	2oz Maple syrup
1/4 cup whole milk	

Spread 4 slices of bread with cream cheese.

Spread remaining slices with Raspberry preserves and press together, forming sandwiches.

In a shallow bowl, mix beaten eggs with milk and Almond extract.

Dip sandwiches to coat.

Melt butter in skillet, place your coated sandwiches in skillet and cook French Toast until golden on both sides.

Sprinkle with confectioner sugar and drizzle with Maple Syrup.
